Hochstein Announces Spring 2019 *Live from Hochstein*Free Lunchtime Concerts and Live Radio Broadcasts

ROCHESTER, N.Y.— The Hochstein School's free lunchtime "brown bag" *Live from Hochstein* concert series resumes on **Wednesday**, **March 20**, **2019**, from 12:10–12:50 pm in the Hochstein Performance Hall with a concert featuring the Ekstasis Duo playing music of Fauré, Ravel, Debussy, and Milhaud. The series continues through Wednesday, May 15.

The concert series gives downtown business people, teachers, families, students, and friends an opportunity to enjoy classical music by outstanding musicians, including soloists, duets, and small ensembles.
