

Meet the HYSO Staff

Dr. Pia Liptak, HYSO Strings Coach

Pia Liptak has performed extensively in Europe and the United States. She is the founder, concertmaster, and former artistic director of Cordancia Chamber Orchestra. She has been on the faculty of The Hochstein School since 2007, receiving the school's Faculty Service Award in 2019. She was previously the concertmaster of the UR Symphony Orchestra and the Fynske Sinfonietta, and a member of the Odense Symphony Orchestra in Denmark. Liptak has recorded three CDs with Japanese Koto-player Ryuko Mizutai in Duo vio-LINK-oto and a CD, *Stars.Stories.Song*, with contemporary music for voice and Ensemble. A new CD, *Reflections*, was released this fall featuring American music, including her own compositions, performed by herself and pianist Yi-Wen Chang. Liptak holds degrees from the Carl Nielsen Academy of Music, and she earned her DMA, as a Fulbright Scholar, from the Eastman School of Music.

Jeremy Stoner, HYSO Brass Coach

Jeremy Stoner joined the faculty of The Hochstein School in September 2007. He teaches tuba, euphonium, and trombone, and coaches student brass ensembles. Since 2005, he has also performed with the Plymouth Brass Quintet along with other Hochstein faculty members. An active freelance musician and teacher in his hometown of Rochester, NY, Stoner holds a Bachelor's degree in music performance from Oberlin Conservatory of Music and a Master's degree in music performance from Northwestern University. In September 2011, he joined the faculty at Nazareth University as Lecturer in Tuba and Euphonium. Along with his teaching duties, Stoner has also performed tuba concertos with the Symphony Orchestra and the Wind Symphony at Nazareth, is a member of the Penfield Symphony, and also plays bass, tuba, and sings with the band Teagan and the Tweeds.

Kirsta Rodean, HYSO Woodwind Coach

Kirsta Rodean is an active educator and performer in the Rochester area. She received a Bachelor's degree in music performance (bassoon) and education as well as a Master's degree in education from the Eastman School of Music. She teaches at both the Fairport Central Schools and The Hochstein School, where she works with students from 5th grade to adult. In addition, she is an active adjudicator for NYSSMA, has presented at the NYSSMA and NYSSBA conferences, is a frequent panelist for concerto competitions, and has written a method book for starting bassoon geared towards experienced musicians.

John Rolland, HYSO Percussion Coach

John Rolland holds a Bachelor's degree in music education and a Master's degree in wind conducting from SUNY Fredonia. As a percussionist, Rolland has performed with the Atlantic Wind Symphony and Western New York Chamber Orchestra and remains active as a rock, jazz, and pit orchestra drummer. He directs the Penfield High School Wind Ensemble and serves as chair of the Penfield music department. Rolland is director of the Junior Wind Symphony and Youth Wind Symphony at The Hochstein School and is a frequent guest conductor of junior and senior high honor bands throughout New York State.

Ruth Gates, HYSO Manager

Ruth Gates became orchestra manager during the 2012-2013 season. In addition, Gates is a Front Office Assistant at The Hochstein School.

HYSO Director



Casey Springstead, Director, earned two degrees from the Eastman School of Music and he is a music educator with the West Irondequoit Schools since 1999. As a guest conductor, he has worked with area ensembles including Cordancia, the Nazareth College Concert Band, Irondequoit Concert Band, Brighton Symphony Orchestra, Rochester's New Horizons Band, and junior high and senior high All-County bands in Western New York.

A faculty member at The Hochstein School since 2003 and the 2017 recipient of the Faculty Service Award, Springstead is the Director of the Hochstein Youth Symphony Orchestra. He has led the HYSO on tours of France, Austria, Spain, Portugal, and Italy, and in 2014, the orchestra participated in a live-viasatellite exchange concert with a youth orchestra from one of Rochester's sister cities in Lithuania. Previous appointments at Hochstein include Director

of the Youth Wind Symphony and Junior Wind Symphony, and Assistant Director of Philharmonia. For several years, he also conducted ensemble.twenty.21, a contemporary music ensemble comprised of faculty from Hochstein, Nazareth University, and Roberts Wesleyan College as well as musicians from the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra. Performances included a live broadcast on WXXI-FM's *Live from Hochstein* series.

Springstead is a hornist with the Penfield Symphony Orchestra since 1999 and has performed with several area ensembles, including Mercury Opera, the Gregory Kunde Chorale, Ad Hoc, Cordancia, and as a member of many pit orchestras and ceremonial brass quintets. He is also active as a collaborative pianist, accompanying Rochester-area high school and college musicians for recitals and auditions. Originally from Hammondsport, NY, he lives in Webster with his wife and fellow musician/educator, Kirsta Rodean, and their two children, Orson and Malin.

GRETCHEN SNEDEKER MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP FOR PRINCIPAL HORN

Gretchen Snedeker, a 24 year-old graduate student at the Eastman School of Music, was tragically killed in a car accident in April 2008. She was principal horn of the Hochstein Youth Symphony Orchestra from 1998 to 2001, and featured on our first tour to Austria in 2001. She discovered her passion for music during her time with HYSO. MORNING MUSICALE SCHOLARSHIP

Morning Musicale was founded in Rochester around 1930. It is an organization of approximately 60 women musicians who meet monthly for chamber music and friendship. Don Messina studied piano and double bass, which he played in the East High School Orchestra and the Eastman School's Conducting Orchestra in the 1950s. He has been a life-long concert-goer and is currently pursuing conducting opportunities. This scholarship is in memory of Don's immigrant parents, Harry and Louise Messina, who loved music and who sacrificed much to encourage his musical aspirations. The Don Messina String Instrument Scholarship covers the HYSO tuition for one year and is awarded annually to a student currently enrolled in elementary, middle, or high school, and plays a stringed instrument. The recipient must display strong potential and outstanding musicianship.

ANNE WILSON YARD MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP FOR PRINCIPAL OBOE

Anne Wilson Yard, a lifelong supporter of the arts, passed away in July 2017.
