## Director, Hochstein Alumni Orchestra



#### Evan Meccarello, Conductor

Evan Meccarello, Artistic Director of Cordancia Chamber Orchestra, is committed to new explorations in classical music and engaging with communities across the Northeast. He is Music Director of the Binghamton Community Orchestra, Founder and Director of the Hochstein Alumni Orchestra, and served as Conductor of the Thames Valley Youth Symphony in New London, CT, for five seasons. He is also an adjunct faculty member at Nazareth University School of Music, directing the Nazareth Chamber Orchestra.

Engagements in the 2023-24 season include appearances as Guest Conductor of the Penfield Symphony Orchestra and Artist in Residence with the theater company Breadcrumbs Productions at Wunderbar in Syracuse, where he created If, an experience that bridges classical chamber music and immersive theater.

A trusted clinician and educator, Meccarello taught conducting and led the orchestra for the 2023 edition of Eastman Experience, an intensive summer program for pre-college musicians at Eastman School of Music. He has appeared as a guest conductor and clinician at schools in four states, including NYSSMA Area All-State and All-County orchestras. Previous summer seasons included teaching for Nazareth's Orchestral Conducting and String Performance program and guest conducting at the Keuka Lake Music Festival.

Meccarello's training in conducting has included lessons and masterclasses with some of the world's most sought-after teachers, including Larry Rachleff, Benjamin Zander, Jorma Panula, and David Effron. He holds a Master's degree in Orchestral Conducting from Bowling Green State University and a Violin Performance degree from Nazareth University, where he was a two-time winner of the school's concerto competition. He can sometimes be found at Argentine tango *milongas*, playing violin for dancers.

## About Hochstein's Alumni Orchestra

Founded in 2010 by Evan Meccarello, the Hochstein Alumni Orchestra (HAO) is a reunion orchestra composed of musicians who received musical training at The Hochstein School. During its history, the orchestra has performed summer concerts in Canandaigua and Perinton, and since January 2011 has performed an annual winter concert in the Hochstein Performance Hall.

In addition to works of standard repertory, the Hochstein Alumni Orchestra has presented world premiere compositions by alumni and noted composers, and also featured alumni soloists. Over the years, HAO has forged connections between members of the Rochester community and beyond, with many of its founding members graduating from noted colleges and universities to become music educators around the region.

### Guest Artists



Jackie Hager, a Rochester born cellist, attends the Juilliard School under the tutelage of Professor Natasha Brofsky. As a soloist, she made her orchestral debut at age 12 with the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra, and has since returned as a featured soloist with them and several other orchestras. She has performed in masterclasses for Wolfgang Schmidt, David Ying, Jeremy Denk, the Takacs Quartet, Patrick Owens, and others. Summer festivals she has attended include the Heifetz International Music Festival, Castleman Quartet Program, Eastman Cello Institute, Bowdoin International Music Festival, and the fellowship program at Madeline Island Chamber Music.

In addition to performing as a soloist, Jackie collaborates and competes in prize-winning chamber groups. Jackie also enjoys teaching and was

happy to return to Hochstein as a part of their 2023 summer faculty. Previously, Jackie was a student of Richard Aaron at the University of Michigan and Kathy Kemp at The Hochstein School. She also received her Bachelor of Science in Neuroscience and Psychology from the University of Michigan.



**Dave Kluge** is a multifaceted bassist, composer, and educator from Rochester, New York. He has received commissions from The Penfield Music Commission Project for music featuring Micheal Dease, Christian Howes, and Gabe Condon as well as "PRISM: American History through New Music," which received National Endowment for the Arts funding. His compositions have been premiered by The Eastman CMS Educators Jazz Ensemble at The Xerox Rochester International Jazz Festival, The ECMS Educators String Orchestra at Kilbourn Hall, Hochstein Alumni Orchestra, and All-County Honors orchestras, jazz ensembles, and choirs.

As an active freelance bassist, he performs with a wide variety of ensembles and can be heard on The Russell Scarbrough Big Band album Fun Times (2023). His string quartet Windmills (2022) is available on Spotify, Apple Music, YouTube, and other streaming platforms, as well as in print at JW Pepper. In 2018, he performed on and engineered the album Doug Stone Jam Session 1 and produced several live video performances with his own band, The Dave Kluge Quintet, which can be found on his YouTube channel.

Kluge earned a Bachelor's degree in Music Education with a concentration in Jazz Studies from SUNY Fredonia and a Master's in Music Education from Nazareth College. From 2007-2013 he taught instrumental music in the West Irondequoit Central School District. Since 2013, he has taught in the Rush-Henrietta Central School District where he serves as Senior High School Orchestra Director.

Jake Kwiatkowski is a member of the Hochstein bagpipe faculty and has been playing bagpipes since he was 5 years old. He has traveled the United States, Canada, and Scotland to compete, perform, and educate. He was a founding member of the Feadan Or Pipe Band in Rochester before competing with the world championship-winning 78th Fraser Highlanders in Toronto, Ontario, Canada

### Program Note

The expression "In bocca al lupo" is an Italian idiom used to wish someone good luck similar to "break a leg" in English. Its origin is thought to come from the hunting world and can be translated as "into the wolf's mouth," to which the traditional reply is, "crepi" or, "may the wolf die." Although this may seem like negative imagery, in Italian culture the expression is seen as a positive gesture to wish someone success in making it through whatever they are facing. By contrast, literally wishing someone "good luck" in Italian is seen as bad luck. *Buona fortuna porta la sfortuna* (good luck brings bad luck). It is this contrast of fortune and misfortune, dark and light, that this piece aims to capture through the simultaneous use of minor and major tonalities and the distantly related keys of C, E and Ab.

Written in Sonata form, the piece begins with jolting ensemble gestures that give way to an intriguing first theme presented by the flutes and bassoons. Variations on this theme are passed through the winds and strings before arriving at the second theme. This regal, flowing melody is played by solo horn then echoed in the strings and flutes before being joined by tutti horns. The percussion brings us into the development with a driving rhythmic pattern over which the themes are passed around in stretto. The music then builds to a pair of visceral sonorities. A placid Adagio moment in the strings and winds brings the music back to its home key of C and into the recapitulation. The coda expands on the use of mode mixture with sweeping upper strings and winds against punctuating triplets in the low strings, winds and brass. The piece ends, not giving way to major or minor, with a descending line. ~ David Kluge
