She has won first place in the CNYAMT Instrumental competition, Syracuse Best for the SFCM Quartet Competition, Honorable Mention for the RPO Young Artist Auditions, as well as the CMM Concerto Competition, where she performed as soloist with the Syracuse Orchestra (formerly Symphoria). She has participated in many ensembles — some of which include the Syracuse Young Artists Orchestra, Hochstein Youth Symphony Orchestra, and Interlochen World Youth Symphony — as well as attending Area All-State as concertmaster and Conference All-State. In her spare time, Mia enjoys cooking and spending time with her cats.

Joanna Frank has been playing cello for 11 years and currently studies with Christopher Haritatos. Joanna is also a student of the Eastman Community Music School, where she will receive her honors diploma upon graduation. A member of HYSO since eighth grade and principal cellist since 11th, Joanna has participated in the HYSO tour to Germany and the Czech Republic, as well as the very recent tour to Italy. A lucky duck, this will be Joanna's 4th time soloing with an orchestra, having played with HYSO in 2022, the Finger Lake Symphony Orchestra in 2023, and with her school orchestra. She recently had the opportunity to perform at the Rochester Hall of Fame induction ceremony. One of Joanna's greater passions is chamber music. Joanna has played in chamber groups since the age of 9, and currently participates in a piano trio, a string trio, and a cello quintet, the latter of the three having recently been awarded first prize in the Syracuse friends of chamber

music competition. For the past two summers, Joanna has attended Point Counter Point chamber music camp in Vermont, and plans on attending again this coming year. Casey Springstead, Director earned two degrees from the Eastman School of Music and he is a music educator with the West Irondequoit Schools since 1999. As a guest conductor, he has worked with area ensembles including Cordancia, the Nazareth College Concert Band, Irondequoit Concert Band, Brighton Symphony Orchestra, Rochester's New Horizons Band, and junior high and senior high All-County bands in Western New York.

A faculty member at The Hochstein School since 2003 and the 2017 recipient of the Faculty Service Award, Mr. Springstead is the Director of the Hochstein Youth Symphony Orchestra. He has led the HYSO on tours of France, Austria, Spain, and Portugal, and in 2014, the orchestra participated in a live-via-satellite exchange concert with a youth orchestra from one of Rochester's sister cities in Lithuania. Previous appointments at Hochstein include Director of the Youth Wind Symphony and Junior Wind Symphony, and Assistant Director

of Philharmonia. For several years, he also conducted ensemble.twenty.21, a contemporary music ensemble comprised of faculty from Hochstein, Nazareth College, and Roberts Wesleyan College as well as musicians from the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra. Performances included a live broadcast on WXXI-FM's *Live from Hochstein* series.

Mr. Springstead is a hornist with the Penfield Symphony Orchestra since 1999 and has performed with several area ensembles, including Mercury Opera, the Gregory Kunde Chorale, Ad Hoc, Cordancia, and as a member of many pit orchestras and ceremonial brass quintets. He is also active as a collaborative pianist, accompanying Rochester-area high school and college musicians for recitals and auditions. Originally from Hammondsport, NY, he lives in Webster with his wife and fellow musician/educator, Kirsta Rodean, and their two children, Orson and Malin.

Meet the HYSO Staff

Dr. Pia Liptak, HYSO Strings Coach

Pia has performed extensively in Europe and the United States. She is the founder, concert-master, and former artistic director of Cordancia Chamber Orchestra. She has been on the faculty of The Hochstein School since 2007 receiving the school's Faculty Service Award in 2019. She was previously the concertmaster of the UR Symphony Orchestra and the Fynske Sinfonietta, and a member of the Odense Symphony Orchestra in Denmark. Pia has recorded three CDs with Japanese Koto-player Ryuko Mizutai in Duo vio-LINK-oto, a CD "Stars.Stories.Song," with contemporary music for voice and Ensemble, and a new CD, "Reflections," is being released later in 2024 featuring American music, including her own compositions, performed by herself and pianist Yi-Wen Chang. Pia holds degrees from the Carl Nielsen Academy of Music, and she earned her DMA, as a Fulbright Scholar, from the Eastman School of Music.

Jeremy Stoner, HYSO Brass Coach

Jeremy Stoner joined the faculty of the Hochstein School in September 2007. He teaches tuba, euphonium, trombone, and coaches student brass ensembles. Since 2005, he has also performed with the Plymouth Brass Quintet along with other Hochstein faculty members since 2005. An active freelance musician and teacher in his hometown of Rochester, NY, Jeremy holds a bachelor's degree in Music Performance from Oberlin Conservatory of Music and a master's degree in Music Performance from Northwestern University. In September 2011, he joined the faculty at Nazareth university as Lecturer in Tuba and Euphonium. Along with his teaching duties, Jeremy has also performed tuba concertos with the Symphony Orchestra and the Wind Symphony at Nazareth, is a member of the Penfield Symphony, and also plays bass, tuba, and sings with the band Teagan and the Tweeds.

Diane Smith, HYSO Woodwind Coach

Diane Smith is a member of the flute section of the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra and a founding member of the Antara Winds. She has also performed with Rochester Oratorio Society, Rochester Broadway Theatre League, Mercury Opera, Lyric Opera, Skaneateles Festival, the Syracuse Symphony, and the Erie Philharmonic. Ms. Smith teaches flute and chamber music at The Hochstein School and Roberts Wesleyan University. At Hochstein, she also serves as Coordinator of Ensembles and Co-Chairperson of the Woodwind, Brass, and Percussion Department.

John Rolland, HYSO Percussion Coach

John Rolland holds a bachelor's degree in music education and a master's degree in wind conducting from SUNY Fredonia. As a percussionist, Rolland has performed with the Atlantic Wind Symphony and Western New York Chamber Orchestra and remains active as a rock, jazz, and pit orchestra drummer. He directs the Penfield High School Wind Ensemble and serves as chair of the Penfield music department. Rolland is director of the Junior Wind Symphony and Youth Wind Symphony at The Hochstein School and is a frequent guest conductor of junior and senior high honor bands throughout New York State.

Ruth Gates, HYSO Manager

Ruth became orchestra manager during the 2012-2013 season. In addition Gates is a Front Office Assistant at The Hochstein School.

He has been a life-long concert-goer and is currently pursuing conducting opportunities. This scholarship is in memory of Don's immigrant parents, Harry and Louise Messina, who loved music and who sacrificed much to encourage his musical aspirations. The Don Messina String Instrument Scholarship covers the HYSO tuition for one year and is awarded annually to a student currently enrolled in elementary, middle or high school, and plays a stringed instrument. ANNE WILSON YARD MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP FOR PRINCIPAL OBOE

Anne Wilson Yard, a lifelong supporter of the arts, passed away in July of 2017.
