Dear Hochstein Families and Friends,

Tonight we recognize 15 of The Hochstein School's most accomplished students – those who have won 2024 Merit Scholarships and those who will complete the Honors Certificate Program this year. We are honored to present these young performers, whose talent, hard work, and achievement reflect that of our school's namesake, David Hochstein.



Merit Scholarships were awarded earlier this year in four sets of auditions for music students (for grades 5-6, 7-8, 9-10, and 11-12). The 45 participating students were nominated by their teachers. Each student presented three contrasting works, which were heard by a panel of judges that included Hochstein faculty members as well as guests from the professional music community. Each winner has received an award that is applied toward their Hochstein tuition. Congratulations to all the winners!

Merit Scholarships are established with endowed gifts from a number of donors, often as a memorial tribute. We are grateful for this encouraging, generous support of our students and our program.

Hochstein's Honors Certificate Program is a multi-year, rigorous program involving individual lessons and an advanced level course of study for each discipline, music theory and history courses, annual juries before a faculty committee, and the presentation of a senior recital. Four students, of 14 total in the program, are presenting their senior recitals this year, and we anticipate that all will complete the requirements for the Certificate. We deeply appreciate the significant ongoing support for this program from the Donald F. and Maxine B. Davison Foundation, and wish our graduating students all the best as they embark on their next chapters of life and learning.

Each of this year's performers has spent countless hours – and years – in practice, lessons, classes, and rehearsals and their work has been supported in myriad ways by parents and other family members, teachers, accompanists – and you, the audience. Thank you for coming together to celebrate their achievements.

Biographies



Nathan Bellinger, cello • Student of Kathleen Murphy Kemp • Sydney and Pearl Rubin Memorial Scholarship

Seventeen-year-old Nathan Bellinger is the fifth child of Mike and Nerina Bellinger. He is a home-schooled junior who has studied cello with Kathy Kemp since fourth grade. In addition to playing cello, he has also played piano, organ, and guitar. At Hochstein, Nathan is a member of the Hochstein Youth Symphony Orchestra, has participated in the Chamber Music Connection program, and is completing the requirements of the Honors Certificate Program. His interests outside of music include lifting weights, taking long walks, and volunteering for the Victor Fire Department. Nathan hopes to study music composition in college.

Lillian Brickman, guitar • Student of Timothy Shannon • David Romig Memorial Scholarship

Lillian Brickman is a junior at School of the Arts, where she is majoring in Visual Arts. She has been studying guitar at Hochstein for 10 years with Timothy Shannon. Lillian has previously won the Walter J. Holloran Memorial Scholarship (2021) as well as the Knights of Pythias Memorial Scholarship (2020). Her hobbies include synchronized swimming, drawing, and cooking. Lillian hopes to attend college on the pre-medical track.





Noah Busch, violin • Student of Pia Liptak • Knights of Pythias Memorial Scholarship

Noah Busch is a 15-year-old sophomore at Brighton High School, and has been playing violin since the age of three. He currently studies with Dr. Pia Liptak, and is on track to complete Hochstein's Honors Certificate Program. He has participated in numerous honors ensembles, including NYSSMA All-County and Area All-State Orchestras, as well as HYSO, which he has been a member of since seventh grade. He has competed in several regional and national violin competitions, recently winning the HYSO Concerto Competition and frequently earning scholarships through Hochstein's Merit Scholarship Program. In 2021, Noah won second place

in the Manolov International Violin and Piano Competition in New York City, and earned the prize for best rendition of a modern piece. Noah has participated in the Hochstein Chamber Music Connection Program since the age of nine, and currently plays in a scholarship quartet that has been together since 2022. He has participated in masterclasses with RPO concertmaster Juliana Athayde and Rachel Barton-Pine. Outside of music, Noah looks forward to playing soccer for his high school's varsity team in 2024 and plans to pursue collegiate study in pre-law and violin performance.

Julian Chumacero, violin • Student of Pia Liptak • Honors Certificate Program Graduate • Diana & Christina Wang Memorial Scholarship

Julian Chumacero is a senior at Victor Senior High School. He has been playing violin since he was eight years old and studies with Dr. Pia Liptak. In addition to violin, Julian also studies piano with Elier Suarez. Julian has been a member of the Hochstein Youth Symphony Orchestra (HYSO) for four years. He has had the honor of winning the 2022 HYSO Concerto Competition as a pianist, and has performed as concertmaster during the 2023-2024 school year. Julian won the 2024 Jo Amish Young Artist Competition and will perform with the Penfield Symphony Orchestra in May 2024. He is a 2024 graduate of



Hochstein's Honors Certificate Program and a member of a Chamber Music Connection piano trio. Julian has participated in several NYSSMA Area All-State and Conference All-State festivals. He has been captain of the Varsity Cross Country Team for two seasons and has run Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field. He is also involved in his school's Math Team, Masterminds Club, Key Club, Music Society, and National Honors Society. Outside of violin, Julian enjoys listening to music and hopes to pursue a career in applied mathematics and violin performance.

Shuwen Ding is a senior at Pittsford Sutherland High School. She has studied cello with Kathleen Kemp since she was nine years old. She has been involved with the Hochstein Youth Symphony Orchestra for four years and has served as assistant principal for the past two years. She has also attended various All-County, Area-All-State, and Conference All-State festivals since Middle School. Outside of music, she enjoys reading, writing, and baking. In the future, she plans to study a medicine-related subject in college.
