# *Dance Faculty bios:*

## *Cheryl Johnson (Tap, Jazz, Musical Theatre)*

Ms. Johnson has performed Off Broadway, at International Dance Festivals, in Music Videos, on TV specials, in nightclubs, and in touring dance companies. In Seattle, she was the dance consultant to the Jimi Hendrix Museum: Experience Music Project and an ambassador of rhythm tap dance hosting festivals, master classes, educational programs, and creating choreography for musical theatre and the concert stage. In NYC, she was a member of Gail Conrad's Tap Dance Theatre, Jerry Ames Tap Dance Company, and performed as a pioneer dancer for the original creation of MTV. She has had the great privilege of honing her craft with tap masters such as Charles 'Cholly' Atkins, Brenda Bufalino, Gregory Hines, Dianne Walker, Arthur Duncan, and the Nicholas Brothers. Cheryl is honored to have choreographed dance works in collaboration with composer/performers such as Octavio Vazquez, The Rita Collective, Ricky Ford, Richard DeLaney, Michael Shrieve, Steve Kim, David Horace Davies, and Ed Hartman.

## *Diane Lewis (Classical Ballet)*

Ms. Lewis holds a Master's Degree in Dance from SUNY Brockport, a Bachelor's degree in Education from Buffalo State University, and is a former member of SUNY Brockport Dance Faculty. Ms. Lewis trained in the Vaganova technique and has worked professionally with Kathleen Crofton, Rudolph Nureyev, Bronislava Nijinska, Alicia Markova and Eva Evdokimova. Ms. Lewis has toured and Europe and the USA as a soloist with the American Classical Ballet and the Festival Ballet of New York. As a principal with the Niagara Frontier Ballet, Ms Lewis performed the Mazurka opposite famous Margot Fonteyn's Prelude in Les Sylphides at the Eastman Theatre. Ms Lewis chaired the Dance department at Hochstein for over 40 years. She now enjoys teaching, choreographing, restaging the classics and coaching master classes.

## *Nydia Padilla-Rodriguez (Caribbean/Latin, Mantón)*

Ms. Padilla-Rodriguez holds a Master's Degree in Education from SUNY Brockport and a Bachelor's Degree in Dance and Elementary Education. She is a former member of the Bottom-of-the-Bucket, But... Dance Company (now Garth Fagan Dance) and is the Founder and Artistic Director of Borinquen Dance Theatre, formerly a Hochstein ensemble-in-residence.

## *Wynton Rice (Modern Dance, Showcase Producer and Interim Chair)*

Wynton Rice is a native Rochesterian who spent 10 years performing internationally with the Garth Fagan Dance Company. He recently joined the Rochester-based contemporary dance company BIODANCE. Wynton also taught at the Garth Fagan Dance School, including dance fundamentals classes for teens and adults, and taught dance for grades K-8 at Eugenio Maria de Hostos Charter School in Rochester. In addition to teaching and serving as an artist-in-residence for schools, he taught a jazz/ballet fusion class at the National Youth Dance Theater in New South Wales, Australia. He holds a Bachelor's Degree in Dance from Ursinus College in Collegeville, PA.

## *Adrienne Santucci (African Dance & Drumming)*

Adrienne has taught a Multi-cultural, Intergenerational program of African Dance & Culture for the City of Rochester Department of Recreation and is a teaching artist (children's theatre) for Kuumba Consultants. She is also a member of Sankofa and Mounafanyi African Dance & Drum Ensembles.

## *Vanessa Watters (Mini-Dancers, Pre-Ballet, Ballet I)*

Vanessa Watters attended the University of Southern California, earning a Bachelor's and Master's Degree in Vocal Arts. She trained with the Los Angeles Civic Light Opera Musical Theatre Workshop, and danced and sang professionally in musical theatre productions throughout Southern California. A long-time ballet student of Stanley Holden, former principal dancer with the Royal Ballet, she taught ballet for many years and also headed a ballet program for the City of Los Angeles Department of Recreation and Parks. In addition to teaching dance and teaching in the Expressive Arts Department here at Hochstein, she teaches ballet for the Perinton Community Center, and studies Dance/Movement Therapy with Danielle Fraenkel of Kinctions Studio here in Rochester.

**Fee: \$15 registration fee; \$350\* tuition**


