About Hochstein's Alumni Orchestra

Founded in 2010 by Evan Meccarello, the Hochstein Alumni Orchestra (HAO) is a reunion orchestra composed of musicians who received musical training at The Hochstein School.

During its history, the orchestra has performed summer concerts in Canandaigua and Perinton, and since January 2011 has performed an annual winter concert in Hochstein's Performance Hall in downtown Rochester.

In addition to works of standard repertory, the Hochstein Alumni Orchestra has presented world premiere compositions by alumni and noted composers, as well as featured alumni soloists from around Western New York. Over the years, HAO has forged connections between members of the Rochester community and beyond, with many of its founding members graduating from noted colleges and universities to become music educators around the region.

The return of these experienced players year after year not only fosters connections between them and the younger musicians, but presents unique energy and camaraderie in performance.

Evan Meccarello, Conductor

Evan Meccarello is founder and director of the Hochstein Alumni Orchestra. Since 2010, he has led the group in world-premiere performances of Rochester composers and showcased talented musicians in a concert tour of the region. He was a member of the Hochstein Youth Symphony Orchestra in high school, serving as Co-Concertmaster and Apprentice Conductor.

Meccarello is currently Music Director of the Binghamton Community Orchestra and Artistic Director of Cordancia

Chamber Orchestra. When many musicians could not play together during the pandemic, he developed and led Music Outside the Box, an all-online festival for high school musicians that featured live virtual ensemble rehearsal and performance. The program was a National Finalist for The American Prize in virtual performance. Meccarello's conducting experience spans professional, collegiate, youth, and community ensembles. This season includes work as cover conductor for the Wheeling Symphony Orchestra (Wheeling, WV) and teaching conducting at Nazareth College. Uptown Tango is his ongoing project playing violin in an Argentine tango duo for dancers and listeners.

Katrina King Nicholson is a native of Marion, New York with bachelor's and master's degrees from the Cleveland Institute of Music and a doctorate from the Shenandoah Conservatory. She is the winner of numerous competitions in the Rochester and Cleveland areas and has performed as soloist with groups including the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra, Finger Lakes Symphony Orchestra, Case Baroque Orchestra, and Cleveland Institute of Music Symphony Orchestra. She has a special interest in music theory and historical performance, holding a music theory minor from CIM and Early Music Performers' Certificates from Case Western Reserve University.

Dr. Nicholson is an active flute teacher and freelancer in the greater D.C. area and currently serves on the faculties of the



International School of Music and the Sharyn Byer Institute of Fine Arts. In her spare time, she enjoys trail runs, classic literature, and experiments in the kitchen.

Program Note Toranj - Aftab Darvishi

Aftab Darvishi was born and raised in Tehran. She now lives in Amsterdam. This is the first performance of *Toranj* in the United States.

Toranj means Bergamot in Persian. Apart from its direct meaning, it also refers to an ancient female name in Iran, which has a symbolic meaning in Persian literature. In addition, Toranj is also one of ancient Persian motifs that is used widely in Persian carpets and rugs. This motif is a mathematical pattern that is typically placed in the middle of the carpet and it may be of any shape (circle, oval, diamond, etc.) but maintaining the mathematical pattern.

I had the pattern as a guide to compose this piece. I used grace notes in combination with long sustained texture by strings to illustrate my interpretation of the pattern in a musical form. Since my inspiration derived from Persian Heritage, I included fragments of Persian Folk music to enhance the musical output and to give an Iranian flavor to the piece. - Aftab Darvishi
