

PERFORMERS

Founded in 1982, the Antara Winds have appeared regularly on *Live from Hochstein* and have performed extensively throughout the greater Rochester area. In addition to presenting traditional repertoire for woodwind quintet, the Antara Winds delight in bringing audiences the music of contemporary composers. They premiered two works written specifically for Antara: Verne Reynolds' *Antara Music* (2003), and Libby Larsen's *Blue Windows: After Marc Chagall* (2005, sextet for wind quintet and piano), and in 2007 participated in a consortium commission of a new work for wind quintet, *Suite Cantabile*, by Bill Douglas. All three works are included in their CD, Antara Music. They performed the world premiere of Chen Yi's Woodwind Quintet No. 3: Suite from China West in 2008 at Eastman School's Kilbourn Hall, as part of the Music and Globalization Symposium, and also performed the work at Cornell University and Syracuse University. Antara Winds has also performed with the Rochester Oratorio Society, the Perinton Concert Band, Society for Chamber Music in Rochester, at SUNY Brockport, at Roberts Wesleyan University, and most recently for the *If Music Be the Food* series.

Diane Smith is a member of the flute section of the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra (RPO) and a founding member of the Antara Winds. She has also performed with the Rochester Oratorio Society, Rochester Chamber Orchestra, Mercury Opera, the Broadway Theatre League, the Skaneateles Festival, the Syracuse Symphony, and the Erie Philharmonic. Ms. Smith teaches flute and chamber music at The Hochstein School and Roberts Wesleyan University. At Hochstein, she also serves as Coordinator of Ensembles and Co-Chairperson of the Woodwind, Brass, and Percussion Department. Ms. Smith received the Bachelor and Master of Music degrees in Performance from the Eastman School of Music, where she studied with Joseph Mariano.

Judith Ricker is a founding member of Antara Winds. She began her career playing in the oboe section of the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra and teaching at The Hochstein School, on whose Board of Directors she has served for many years. She remains an active freelance artist and has spent her career straddling the arts and business worlds. After receiving an MBA from the Simon School of the University of Rochester, she held senior market research positions at Eastman Kodak, Harris Interactive, and Market Probe, and received multiple industry awards. Judy teaches "Marketing for Musical Enterprises" in the Eastman School of Music's graduate degree program, Master of Arts in Music Leadership. She is also the oboe instructor at Nazareth College and performs with the faculty Wilmot Woodwind Quintet. Besides her MBA, she holds a BM and MM from the Eastman School of Music, as well as the coveted Performer's Certificate.

Margaret (Peggy) Quackenbush, a founding member of Antara Winds, is an active performer of orchestral and chamber music throughout greater Rochester. She retired in 2022 after serving 43 years at The Hochstein School – including the past 30 years as its President & Executive Director. There, she led the expansion of its music, dance, and expressive arts therapies programs and the development of the Hochstein Performance Hall. She has received many awards for her leadership in and service to the field of community arts education. She holds the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Performance from the Eastman School of Music, where she studied with D. Stanley Hasty.

Dr. Blaire Koerner is an accomplished chamber and contemporary bassoonist, educator, and career advisor. She is co-founder of Hats+Heels, a bassoon and harp duo that focuses on interdisciplinary storytelling and commissioning. As a freelancer in upstate New York, she has performed with groups such as Ensemble Signal, Symphoria, and Broadway's tour of *My Fair Lady*. As an educator, Dr. Koerner is adjunct bassoon professor at Syracuse University and instructor at Eastman Community Music School, where she received the Jack L. Frank Award for Excellence in Teaching in 2016. As the Assistant Director of Eastman School of Music's Institute for Music Leadership, Dr. Koerner instructs and advises musicians of all levels on developing knowledge, skill sets, and connections that will help them fulfill their dreams and career goals. Dr. Koerner has a Doctorate in Bassoon Performance and Literature from the Eastman School of Music.

Nikolette LaBonte is the Associate/Assistant/Utility Horn of the RPO, where she has served since 2016, and during the 2022-23 season also has the privilege of performing as Visiting Guest Principal Horn of the Baltimore Symphony Orchestra. Originally from South Florida, Nikolette also serves as the principal horn of the *Music in the Mountains* summer festival, previously held a position with the Hawaii Symphony Orchestra, and served as Acting Principal Horn of the Fort Worth Symphony from 2019-21. She has also had the opportunity to perform with orchestras across North America including guest principal engagements with the New York Philharmonic, Vancouver Symphony, Tucson Symphony, and the Dallas Chamber Symphony.
