PERFORMERS

Dr. Ken Luk has performed at the Chamber Music America Ensemble Showcase, Experiencing Villa-Lobos Festival, *Live from Hochstein*, Rochester Fringe Festival, The Great Blue Heron Festival, and Grassroots Festival of Music and Dance. Ken is the Cofounder of Rochester Classical Guitar and the Rochester Mandolin Orchestra, and serves on the Board of the Classical Mandolin Society of America. An avid arranger, he was a finalist in the 2017 Roland Dyens Arranging International Competition. Ken holds Doctor of Musical Arts and Master of Music Degrees in classical guitar and music theory pedagogy from the Eastman School of Music. Ken is on faculty at the Eastman School of Music, Eastman Community Music School (ECMS), SUNY Geneseo, and Alfred University.

Pianist and Rochester native **Howard Spindler's** over 40 years of teaching has included piano lessons, chamber music coaching, and Dalcroze Eurhythmics/Music Theory at both ECMS and the Eastman School of Music. At ECMS he was awarded the Jack L. Frank Award for outstanding teaching, and he has served as Interim Director/Associate Dean.

Soprano Dr. Joanna Hyunji Kim has performed across the USA and internationally, including at Carnegie Hall. Born in the US but raised in South Korea, Dr. Kim has presented lecture-recitals on Korean diction and art song at the Harvard Graduate Music Forum Conference, Roberts Wesleyan University, and the Eastman School of Music, where she was nominated for the Lecture Recital Prize. A passionate teacher, Dr. Kim is on faculty at ECMS and was awarded the Teaching Assistant Prize for Excellence in Teaching for her work instructing voice students at the University of Rochester during her master's and doctoral studies. She is the founder of Senoreh Inc., which focuses on restoring the Biblical perspective with artistic excellence in music. Dr. Kim graduated with her bachelors degree from Ewha Woman's University, and later earned Master of Music Degrees in voice performance and music education in the studio of Dr. Robert McIver, and a Doctor of Musical Arts Degree in voice performance and literature under the guidance of Dr. Retzlaff at the Eastman School of Music.

Brazilian American guitarist Bernardo Marcondes began his guitar studies with Dr. Steven Thachuk, Dr. Kate Lewis, and Ron Borczon at California State University, Northridge, where he was a recipient of the Gus & Erika Manders and Segovia Endowment Scholarships while earning his bachelors and masters degrees. Bernardo was awarded a Performer's Certificate at the Koblenz International Guitar Academy and Festival, where he studied with Hubert Kaeppel. He later earned his Doctoral Degree in classical guitar performance and literature from the Eastman School of Music under Dr. Nicholas Goluses. Bernardo has premiered works by Marcelo Lazcano and Felipe Rossi, and is a part of the project Violões de Tiradentes, performing original works for guitar chamber ensembles. He is the head of the guitar studio at St. Peters Community Arts Academy in Geneva, NY, and performs throughout the region with groups such as Rosa Boemia, Trio Ghidorah, Duo Lalena-Marcondes, and the Rochester Mandolin Orchestra.
