PERFORMERS

Anne Kunkle is a saxophonist and educator based in Rochester, New York. She has been a prize winner at the Musician's Club of Women Competition in Chicago, IL, and the Fischoff Chamber Music Competition. Ms. Kunkle has performed at prestigious venues across the United States and abroad, including the Esplanade Theater in Singapore, where she performed and recorded an album of Shostakovich's music with the Singapore Symphony Orchestra.

Ms. Kunkle is currently on the saxophone faculty at Nazareth University, Syracuse University, Roberts Wesleyan University, and the Eastman Community Music School, where she received the Jack L. Frank award for excellence in teaching. Ms. Kunkle has earned degrees at the Eastman School of Music and the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. Her primary teachers include Chien-Kwan Lin and Debra Richtmeyer.

Bonnie Choi is a harpsichordist and pianist based in Rochester, NY. As an educator, Dr. Choi has given presentations internationally on piano pedagogy, piano performance, and harpsichord performance. She was a visiting faculty member at Shandong Normal University in China, and currently teaches harpsichord and piano at Nazareth University. As a performer, she is the founder and harpsichordist of Air de Cour, and the keyboardist for Symphoria.

Kevin Nitsch is a pianist, collaborator, and educator in the Rochester area. Kevin performs regularly with Rochester Oratorio Society, Finger Lakes Opera, Lyric Opera, and Madrigalia. Kevin holds a Bachelors of Music in Piano Performance from the University of Missouri-Kansas City, as well as a Masters of Music and a Doctorate of Musical Arts from the Eastman School of Music.

Tenor Pablo Willey-Bustos is a graduate of the Eastman School of Music, where he received both his Bachelor and Master Degrees in vocal performance. Mr. Willey-Bustos is an in -demand musician in the Western New York Region, having performed extensively with many groups, including the Orchestra of St. Lukes, the Buffalo Philharmonic Chorus, and La Donna Musicale, among others. His discography includes The Lutheran Masses and Advent Cantatas of J. S. Bach with the Publick Musick Baroque Orchestra and Chorus, and a guest appearance on Soprano Andrea Folan's CD of Haydn Lieder, all available on the Musica Omnia Label. Mr. Bustos was a finalist in the Philadelphia Bach Festival's International Bach Aria Competition and received third place in the Rochester Oratorio Society's Vocal Competition. He is the Organist and Director of Music Ministry for Reformation Lutheran Church.

Upcoming engagements for Mr. Willey-Bustos include Handel's Messiah with the Fort Street Chorale, Bach's St. John's Passion with the Voices Ensemble, as well as a recital with pianist Beryl Garver, as part of the Rochester Institute of Technology's Faculty Spotlight Recital Series featuring music by Schumann and Argento.
