Knights of Pythias Memorial Scholarship recipient Noah Busch is a sophomore at Brighton High School and has been playing violin since the age of three. He currently studies with Dr. Pia Liptak at the Hochstein School. He has participated in numerous NYSSMA honors ensembles, including being twice named concertmaster to the All Monroe County Orchestra. In 2021, Noah participated in the Manolov International Violin and Piano Competition in New York City, earning second place and best rendition of a modern piece. Noah has played in masterclasses for Juliana Athayde and Rachel Barton-Pine. At Hochstein, Noah has participated in the Chamber Music Connection program since the age of nine, and has been playing with a scholarship quartet since 2022. A member of the Hochstein Youth Symphony Orchestra since seventh grade, Noah won the HYSO Concerto



Competition in 2023 and performed the Gade violin concerto. Noah has been a Hochstein merit scholarship recipient on numerous occasions and is on track to complete its Honors Certificate Program. Outside of music, Noah enjoys playing soccer and plans to pursue Pre-Law and Violin Performance in college.



Diana and Christina Wang Memorial Scholarship recipient Julian Chumacero is a senior at Victor High School in Victor, NY and studies violin at The Hochstein School with Dr. Pia Liptak. Julian has been in the Hochstein Youth Symphony Orchestra, Hochstein's premier youth orchestra, for four years and is currently concertmaster. He is also a talented pianist, winning the HYSO Concerto Competition on piano in 2022. In addition to violin lessons and HYSO, Julian is also a part of the Honors Certificate Program at Hochstein, and has been successful in Hochstein's Merit Scholarship Competition, having been a recipient of the Diana and Christina Wang Memorial Scholarship for two years in a row. After high school, Julian hopes to pursue Applied Mathematics and Violin Performance.
