PERFORMERS

Japanese saxophonist Dr. Chisato Eda Marling started playing piano at age three and saxophone at age eight. She was first taught by her father, who was also a saxophone player. After graduating from Musashino Academia Musicae in Tokyo, Japan, she pursued her love of playing the saxophone at the University of Minnesota, receiving her master's degree. In 2001 she moved to Rochester to complete her doctoral degree at the Eastman School of Music with a minor in Musician's Wellness. She is currently the Manager of Education and Community Partnerships for the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra as well as a Saxophone Instructor at the Eastman Community Music School. Chisato is also a distinguished Vandoren Performing Artist.

Barbara Brown earned her Master of Music Degree in Saxophone Performance and Literature from the Eastman School of Music, and was awarded a Performer's Certificate. She has bachelor's degrees in Saxophone Performance and Anthropology from the University of Washington, where she won the school's concerto competition. She has performed in Japan, Italy, Canada, and all over the US. Barbara is currently the Vice President of Education for the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra.

Erik Piazza teaches music in the Webster Central School District, and previously taught in the Palmyra-Macedon CSD and at the Rochester Institute of Technology. Erik earned a Bachelor of Music in Saxophone Performance and Music Education and a Master of Music in Music Education from the Eastman School of Music. Erik is currently a PhD candidate at the Eastman School and has presented original research at regional, state, and national conferences. He has been invited to present lectures at numerous colleges and institutions, and is published in *School Music News* and the *Journal of Music Teacher Education*. Erik is a guest conductor and NYSSMA certified woodwind adjudicator whose students have been selected to perform with county, state, and national honors ensembles. Additionally, Erik is co-founder and Senior Editor at *Low Down Music Publishing*, a small company dedicated to helping musicians produce books for music teachers and self-guided learners.

Nancy Boone-Bahr received her bachelor's and master's degrees from the Eastman School of Music, where she also earned a Performer's Certificate and was a soloist with the Eastman Wind Ensemble. Ms. Boone-Bahr performs regularly in a variety of genres throughout the Western New York region, including multiple appearances with the Rochester Philharmonic, Buffalo Philharmonic, and Symphoria Orchestras. She has been a member of the Hochstein faculty since 1993.
