Since their debut in 2018, the **Ekstasis Duo** has appeared on distinguished national stages such as New York's Merkin Hall, Arizona's Del E. Webb Center for the Performing Arts, Ohio's Holland Theater, Maryland's Resonance Chamber Music Series, and *The Strings Music Festival* in Steamboat Springs, Colorado.

The duo produced their first CD, "Women's Voices," in the fall of 2021. For purchase, please

visit <u>www.ekstasisduo.com/single-project</u>. They are currently in the finishing stages of a second CD, "...From the Shadows," to be released in the fall of 2023.

This year's programs, "Slavic Masters" and "Sophisticated Lady," can be heard in upcoming concerts at Merkin Hall in New York City, Saugerties' Pro Musica, Rochester's *Live from Hochstein*, and at the University of Albany Performing Arts Center.

The duo premiered a concerto for Cello, Piano, and Orchestra, written for them by renowned Israeli-American composer, Avner Dorman. Commissioned by a consortium that includes the Fredonia Foundation and the Sewanee Summer Music Festival, the premiere took place in July 2022 with the Sewanee Summer Music Festival Orchestra, followed by an October performance with the College Symphony Orchestra in King Concert Hall at SUNY Fredonia.

Natasha (cello) and Eliran (piano) met at Juilliard. Later, as colleagues at SUNY Fredonia, they decided to perform masterpieces alongside recently-discovered jewels, with a special regard for minority figures. Ekstasis has given lectures online and in person both nationally and at an international conference on women composers in Lucca, Italy. They gave a multimedia performance involving live music and video as a result of winning Fredonia's Kasling Award and published a paper on women's compositions for cello and piano in the online journal, The College Music Society Symposium.
