### **PERFORMERS**

2016 finalists of the chamber music performance professional division of *The American Prize Competition*, the *Telos Trio: Music that Connects* has been hailed as inventive, exquisite, and captivating. The trio are active performers who prioritize innovative partnerships, collaborating across disciplines. In 2017 they performed the premier of composer Gwyneth Walker's piece "Equality Now!". The trio later presented musical celebrations of "Equality Now!" for the centennial of New York State women's suffrage, partnering with the National Women's Rights Museum, the Susan B. Anthony House and Museum, and the Hochstein School. In 2019 they commissioned and premiered "Fresh Wind in Our Sails" by Cary Ratcliff for a collaboration including The Children's Agenda to celebrate the centennial of the Greater Rochester Community of Churches. Other partnerships have included collaborations with photographers of Camera Rochester, labyrinth facilitators from the Ontario Center Presbyterian Church, composer Frederick Boyle, and storyteller Jay Stetzer.

All faculty members at The Hochstein School, the musicians of the Telos Trio value education, offering masterclasses and educational performances. In 2019 they presented masterclasses and concerts at DePauw and Otterbein Universities as well as performances in Indianapolis, IN, and Columbus, OH. Other recent appearances include ClarinetFest, the National Flute Association Convention, and at the Chautauqua Institution. They have been invited guests on the concert series of Hochstein's *Spotlight on Faculty*, Corning Community College, the Schuyler County Concerts in Watkins Glen, NY, the Morning Musicales series in Syracuse, NY, and the Rochester Memorial Art Gallery, in addition to a number of Churches, both in upstate New York and across the USA. Telos Trio performances have and have been broadcast on WXXI Classical and WCNY/FM 91.3.
