PERFORMERS

Pianist Yi-Wen Chang has appeared as a soloist and collaborative pianist in the United States and abroad, performing in venues such as Eastman Theatre's Kodak Hall, Taiwan National Concert Hall in Taipei, National Chiao-Tung University in Taiwan, and Johannesen International School of Arts in Canada. Chang holds a Bachelor of Music Degree from the Eastman School of Music, where she was awarded the prestigious Performer's Certificate. After receiving a Master of Music Degree from the Juilliard School, she returned to Eastman and earned her Doctor of Musical Arts Degree in piano performance and literature.

An active concert pianist, Chang has worked with distinguished artists such as Rebecca Penneys, Ian Bousfield, Ramon Ricker, and Jeffrey Milarsky, as well as large ensembles including the Eastman Philharmonia and Eastman Wind Ensemble. She has performed as part of the Moscow Conservatory International Summer Festival and the Women in Music Festival in Rochester, New York. Her performances have been broadcast on WXXI and WBFO radio. Chang recently collaborated with violinist Pia Liptak to record the CD album, Reflections, which will be released by Centaur Records in the fall of 2024. Chang has developed a keen interest in exploring stylistic progression of music and is known for creating innovative concert programs. In 2015 she launched the "Then and Now" concert series, which combines traditional and contemporary music, showcasing their transformation from the past to the present. She is particularly fascinated by new compositions and re-creative repertoire, including piano transcriptions from songs, operas, symphonies, and other musical genres. Chang's compositions and transcriptions include Taiwanese folk song Longing for the Spring Breeze and Imminence and A Stream of Thought, and her recently premiered Between Mozart and Chopin. Chang regularly performs music of our time, and recently gave the U.S. premiere of Spanish composer, Benet Casablancas' Dos Páginas para Granados.

In addition to performing extensively as a soloist and collaborator, Chang is a dedicated pedagogue. She has served as an adjudicator for numerous piano competitions, including the MTNA New York State Competition, Nazareth College Piano Competition, and Taiwan Biennial National Piano Competition. Chang currently serves on the piano faculty at Hobart and William Smith Colleges and The Hochstein School, where she serves as Co-Chair of the Piano Department. She is also on staff as a collaborative pianist at Nazareth University and SUNY Geneseo. Additionally, Chang published the Chinese translation of R.O.Morris' Figured Harmony at The Keyboard (Oxford University Press), which has become widely used in colleges in Chinese-speaking countries.
