Hochstein's Spotlight on Faculty Series Features Vocalists, Woodwinds, Saxophones, Pianos, and Tap Dancing!

Hochstein faculty members collaborate on intriguing concerts featuring classical music and beyond

ROCHESTER, N.Y.— The **Spotlight on Faculty** concert series at The Hochstein School returns on **Friday, October 21, 2022 at 7:00 pm** in Hochstein Performance Hall with **Fearless Females**, a program celebrating female composers and featuring songs written for female voice, performed by members of Hochstein's voice faculty. The series continues through May 2023.

Other concerts on the series feature: the **Gossamer Edge** trio performing hidden gems of love and life; **Vertex Saxophone Quartet** performing music by Bach and beyond; **Telos Trio** performing "Fresh Wind for Our Sails," a new work by Rochester composer Cary Ratcliff; Morton Gould's **"Tap Dance Concerto;"** and **Celebration of the Piano** with works for one to four pianos and two to eight hands. *See below for calendar listings for the entire Spotlight series.*

Since 1991, *Spotlight on Faculty* has highlighted the accomplished Hochstein faculty in a variety of ensembles, musical genres, and styles from chamber music and dance to jazz, contemporary, and classical. A key feature of the *Spotlight on Faculty* concerts is that Hochstein faculty members collaborate across departments to create innovative and unique programs.

Concerts take place on Thursday or Friday nights at 7:00 pm and run one hour in the Hochstein Performance Hall. Admission at the door is \$10 per person, with a \$20 family maximum. Concerts are free to Hochstein students/families, faculty, and staff. The voice-flute-piano trio Gossamer Edge was formed in 2012 to explore the vibrant repertory for this trio combination, as well as solo literature and duos combining the instruments in different ways that make for intriguing and varied programs.

Commissioned by the Telos Trio from composer Cary Ratcliff in 2019, *Fresh Wind for Our Sails* is a colorful, evocative, and engaging composition inspired by a century of peace and justice work in Rochester. The program also includes Gwyneth Walker's *Equality Now!* (with guest reader Sandra Boysen Sluberski), which traces the beginning of the women's movement in Seneca Falls; Miguel del Aguila's *Disagree*; and Alex Shapiro's *Desert Thoughts*.

The trio plans to record these pieces for a new CD that celebrates past achievements and harnesses new energy for the work that lies ahead.
