Hochstein Youth Symphony Orchestra performs Spring Concert

Program includes music by Rossini, Gould, Strauss, Montgomery, Bernstein, and Grieg

ROCHESTER, N.Y.— The **Hochstein Youth Symphony Orchestra (HYSO)** performs its spring concert on **Sunday, May 14, at 3:00 pm**. Casey Springstead directs the orchestra in a program that includes Rossini's exciting Overture to *William Tell*, Gould's tour de force *American Salute*, Johann Strauss Jr.'s popular "Thunder and Lightning" Polka, *Starburst* by Leonard Bernstein Award and Sphinx Medal of Excellence winner Jessie Montgomery, and Bernstein's dramatic Suite from *On the Waterfront*. HYSO Concerto Competition winner Julian Chumacero performs the distinctive first movement from Grieg's Piano Concerto in A minor.

Julian Chumacero was selected, along with Elizabeth Runion, as one of two winners of the HYSO Concerto Competition after a very competitive round of auditions in November. A junior at Victor Senior High School, he has been studying piano with Elier Suarez for 5 years. He has received prizes in the Vincent Lenti Piano Competition, Nazareth Piano Competition, and Junior All-Star Piano Competition. He has also been studying violin with Pia Liptak at Hochstein for 5 years. He has participated in the NYSSMA Area All-State and Conference All-State festivals and is also part of the Westiyane String Quintet at Hochstein. He is in the Hochstein Honors Certificate Program and has been awarded scholarships from the Hochstein Merit Scholarship Competition. Julian is captain of the Varsity Cross Country Team and was named a Section V All-Star in 2022 and also runs in Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field. He is a member of his school's Math Team, Masterminds Club, Key Club, Music Society, and National Honors Society.

The 79-member HYSO is a full orchestra for advanced strings, brass, woodwinds, and percussion. Directed by Casey Springstead, the HYSO presents three concerts per year along with periodic

international tours including a 2016 tour of Austria and Germany, a 2018 tour of Portugal and Spain, and the 2022 tour of Germany and the Czech Republic. In Spring 2024, HYSO will tour Italy with performances in Rome, Florence, and Cremona – along with visits to Vatican City, the Leaning Tower of Pisa, and La Scala Opera House in Milan.
