Featuring a full range of music and dance classes for learners of all ages and abilities

ROCHESTER, N.Y.— **The Hochstein School** knows firsthand the transformational effects of the arts on an individual's emotional, physical, and mental well-being. People of all ages, abilities, and experience levels choose to learn at Hochstein because they can be themselves while pursuing their interests and passions. Classes are taught by an accomplished faculty of professional artists and educators. Hochstein's school year begins on **Wednesday, September 4, 2024** and offers a full range of music, dance, and Expressive Arts (therapeutic) classes.

The Hochstein website (<u>www.hochstein.org</u>) has a list of all the offerings, organized by category of interest. Highlights include:

- Individual instrument and voice lessons as well as music theory classes;
- Music FUNdamentals classes for children ages 6 months to 5 years;
- Suzuki Violin, Viola, Cello, Harp, and Flute based on the philosophy that any child can learn to play an instrument;
- Orchestral ensemble performance opportunities for students in grades 1-12;
- Choral, wind instrument, and chamber music ensembles;
- Jazz combos and rock bands;
- Group classes in guitar, ukulele, bagpipes, and voice;
- Sequential ballet instruction for ages 3 to adult;
- Dance classes in tap, hip hop, African, Flamenco, Latin, jazz, and modern; and
- Music, art, and dance therapy through the Expressive Arts program.

Adult learners (18+) can choose from a variety of classes, including:

- Ensemble performance opportunities with HochStrings Adult Chamber Orchestra, chamber groups, cello choir, guitar ensembles, jazz combos, and rock bands;
- Individual instrument lessons on a wide variety of instruments; and
- Dance classes including ballet, tap, modern, Flamenco, and Latin social dance.
