Ditch the Cube and Catch Some Tunes This Summer at Free Hochstein at High Falls Concert Series

Free weekly concert series runs June 9-August 18, 2016, at Granite Mills Park, with support from Hochstein, High Falls Business Association, and WXXI

ROCHESTER, N.Y.— The 2016 Hochstein at High Falls summer concert series will once again fill the city's High Falls District with the sounds of local music at 12:10 pm every Thursday beginning June 9 (except for July 7). The series kicks off with the high-energy cover band Something Else offering a little something for everyone. The featured musical talent will vary each week, including Americana, jazz, blues, Latin, folk, and indie-rock.

The 10-week series includes: Something Else (June 9), Talking Under Water (June 16), Woody Dodge (June 23), Mambo Kings (June 30), The Dady Brothers (July 14), Jackson Cavalier & the Fevertones (July 21), The White Hots (July 28), Multibird (August 4), Cammy Enaharo (August 11), and Mounafanyi Pan-African Percussion and Dance (August 18). The Hochstein at High Falls concerts – presented by High Falls Business Association, Hochstein School of Music & Dance, and WXXI – begin at 12:10 pm at the Granite Mills Park near the Pont de Rennes Bridge. In the event of rain, the indoor concert location will be announced via social media. Attendees are encouraged to bring their own seating and lunch, or pick up a lunch at the many area restaurants, including La Luna and Fina's Café. Each performance will run approximately 50 minutes.

Together since 1995, the Mambo Kings are enjoying great success as Upstate New York's foremost Latin jazz ensemble, and have rapidly earned a national reputation for their explosive blend of Afro-Cuban rhythms and jazz improvisation. Western New York's favorite troubadours, The Dady Brothers are a musical duo who have been performing and winning the hearts of crowds professionally for more than 40 years. He also has worked with the likes of The YeahYeahYeahs, Dan Deacon, Animal Collective, Regina Spektor, Jeffrey Lewis, and Moldy Peaches, among others. Hochstein at High Falls: Cammy Enaharo

Rochester-based baritone ukulele player Cammy Enaharo started writing music in 2010 after getting her first ukulele for Christmas. Her lyrics are personal and relatable stories with soulful vocals. Hochstein at High Falls: Mounafanyi Pan-African Percussion and Dance

Thursday, August 18; 12:10 pm; Granite Mills Park, Platt/Browns Race, Rochester, NY; free.

Rochester's only Pan-African performing group, Mounafanyi Percussion and Dance Ensemble features musicians and dancers from Guinea, Ghana, the Congo, the Ivory Coast, and the United States. Their performances weave incredible drumming sequences – including West Africa's iconic djembe hand drum – together with high-energy dance to create a spectacular tapestry of movement and sound. The group is led by Artistic Director Kerfala "Fana" Bangoura, a long-time member of Guinea's most prestigious national performing groups – Les Ballets Africains and Les Percussions de Guinée – who also teaches drumming and dance at the University of Rochester.
