HYSO Director Casey Springstead Receives 2017 Hochstein Faculty Service Award

At the Hochstein All-Faculty Meeting on Saturday, September 9, Hochstein President & Executive Director Margaret Quackenbush recognized Hochstein Youth Symphony Orchestra (HYSO) Director **Casey Springstead** as the winner of the **2017 Faculty Service Award**. She said, "As a longtime member of our ensembles faculty, Casey has been an incredibly thoughtful, dedicated, inspiring musician and educator, giving all the students who've had the good fortune to play under his baton the finest musical leadership I can imagine."

The Faculty Service Award was first given in 1990 to recognize the contributions of outstanding faculty members to the work of the Hochstein School. Nominations are solicited from the entire faculty, from a list of those who have completed at least five years of teaching at Hochstein.

Casey Springstead has been a member of Hochstein's faculty since 2003, and HYSO Director since 2012. He conducts weekly rehearsals and several concerts a year by the HYSO, which is an advanced youth orchestra comprised of grade 7-12 students from all over the Rochester region. A graduate of the Eastman School of Music, Springstead is also a music educator with the West Irondequoit Schools, a guest conductor with a number of area ensembles, and hornist with the Penfield Symphony Orchestra. He lives in Webster with his wife and Hochstein faculty member, Kirsta Rodean, and their two children, Orson and Malin.
