## **Hochstein at High Falls Concert Series Returns for 2025**

Free Concerts Featuring Beloved Local Talent Run Thursdays, June 5-August 7

Rochester, NY — The **Hochstein at High Falls** lunchtime summer concert series returns to the city's High Falls District beginning **Thursday**, **June 5**, **2025**, and running through August 7 (except for Thursday, June 19th and Thursday, July 3rd). The featured musical talent will vary each week and features an eclectic lineup of well-loved local and regional bands. The concerts are free and open to the public.

The 8-week series includes: Steve Grills and the Roadmasters (June 5), Mountain • River • Traveler (June 12), John Dady (June 26), Debbie Kendrick Project (July 10), Watkins and the Rapiers (July 17), Mambo Kings (July 24), Candy (July 31), and A Girl Named Genny (August 7).

Hosted by Hannah Maier of The Route/WRUR 88.5, the concerts begin at 12:10 pm in the outer parking lot at 4 Commercial Street, corner of Browns Race. In case of rain, concerts will move indoors to Monroe Community College's Downtown Campus, with weather-related updates announced by 10:30 am on the day of each performance via Hochstein's website and social media.

Parking Info: Public parking is available at the High Falls Parking Garage. Please note: the lot at 4 Commercial Street and the MCC lot across the street are for permit holders only.
